
NATURAL METAPHORS

INTRODUCTION

A Stone Is a Story is a helpful mentor text for talking about vivid verbs, word choice, rhythm, and organization. You can also use A Stone Is a Story to explore metaphor and to create a collaborative classroom book based around this literary device.

STEPS

- Have students find a simple natural object they are curious about.
- Depending on the age group, you may ask them to research their object.
- Based on what they have learned about the object, ask students to use the Brainstorming worksheet to brainstorm metaphors that describe their object.
- Have students choose the metaphor from the list that best describes their object.
- Using the template included below, have students write out their chosen metaphor and explanation. Invite them to illustrate.
- Bind students' pages together to create a classroom book about nature, told through metaphor.
